## War Brides toast Queen on Diamond Jubilee Year





## Remember When . . . .

. . . . . we all had to 'Make do and Mend'? Remember darning holes in the toes and patiently mending ladders in our stockings? I was given a green dress (no coupons) that was worn under the arms, so I cut out the sleeves, patched the worn bits and knitted new sleeves. When I started work my school uniform tunic was turned into a skirt, and I made a blue and white striped blouse from a man's shirt. Of course, we all knitted, and I well remember Mrs. Woodley - the family shared our air raid shelter - constantly knitting - when she wasn't unpicking. She always wore knitted dresses and skirts and tops and she would unpick a dress which then reappeared as a cardigan. The leftover wool might become a pair of socks for her husband or perhaps some woolly gloves! Second hand clothes did not require clothing coupons, and I reluctantly, bought a plain black dress and then made different coloured collars for it - very classy! I worked with a girl who used little scraps of wool to crochet tiny woolly flowers which she put together in a little bunch with a safety pin on the back - and lo and behold - a brooch. If you could get hold of buttons with a shank on the back, and if you had long earlobes (like mine) with a hairpin and bit of bending you could create earrings! When I was trying to gather a few bits to bring to Canada, I had a strange windfall. An elderly gentleman, who lived across from my girl friend's family, appeared one evening to play cards. He carried a small brown paper parcel, tied up with string, which he handed to me. We all knew that his late wife had been a dressmaker but I was really surprised to find several lengths of fabric, one of pale pink silk chiffon, one white 'jap' silk and the other black silk lace!! From these I created 3 cami-knickers! Quite exotic! Do you remember the shoes with suede uppers and hinged wooden soles? They were fewer coupons than regular, but made a lot of noise! Those were the days of no waste, and recycling was a way of life - not a choice!
